We, Her Majesty's most dutiful and faithful subjects, the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Ontario, in session assembled, approach Your Honour with sentiments of unfeigned devotion and loyalty to Her Majesty's person and Government, and humbly beg to present for Your Honour's acceptance a bill entitled "An Act to authorize the expenditure of certain amounts for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2004"/ «Loi autorisant l'utilisation de certaines sommes pour l'exercice se terminant le 31 mars 2004».

To this Act the Royal Assent was announced by the Clerk of the Legislative Assembly in the following words:-

"His Honour the Lieutenant Governor doth thank Her Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, accept their benevolence and assent to this bill in Her Majesty's name."
