Ms. Churley from the Standing Committee on Regulations and Private Bills presented the Committee's Report which was read as follows and adopted:-

Your Committee begs to report the following Bill as amended:

Bill 209, An Act to amend the Highway Traffic Act with respect to the suspension of drivers' licences.

Pursuant to Standing Order 72(b), the Bill was Ordered for Second Reading.

During "Oral Questions", the Speaker requested the Member for Bruce-Grey-Owen Sound (Mr. Murdoch) to come to order.

The Member having refused was named by the Speaker and directed to withdraw from the service of the House for the balance of the sessional day.

ORDERS OF THE DAY

A debate arose on the motion for Second Reading of Bill 27, An Act to amend the Arbitration Act, 1991, the Child and Family Services Act and the Family Law Act in connection with family arbitration and related matters, and to amend the Children's Law Reform Act in connection with the matters to be considered by the court in dealing with applications for custody and access.

After some time, pursuant to Standing Order 9, the motion for the adjournment of the debate was deemed to have been made and carried.

Debate was resumed on the motion for Second Reading of Bill 210, An Act to amend the Child and Family Services Act and make complementary amendments to other Acts.

After some time, the motion was declared carried and the Bill was accordingly read the second time and Ordered referred to the Standing Committee on Social Policy.

The House then adjourned at 6:24 p.m.
