The Acting Speaker directed that the Members be called in, for which purpose the division bells were rung.

During the ringing of the bells, the Acting Speaker addressed the House as follows:-

I have received a request from the Chief Government Whip, under Standing Order 28(h), that the vote on the motion for Third Reading of Bill 211 be deferred until Thursday, December 8, 2005.

Therefore the vote is accordingly deferred.

After some time, the motion was declared carried and the Bill was accordingly read the second time and Ordered referred to the Standing Committee on Justice Policy.

With unanimous consent, on motion by Mr. Caplan,

Ordered, That the Standing Committee on General Government be authorized to meet past 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday, December 7, 2005 for the purpose of clause-by-clause consideration of Bill 206, An Act to revise the Ontario Municipal Employees Retirement System Act, until consideration of the Bill is completed.

The House then adjourned at 5:48 p.m.
