Yesterday, the Member for Lanark—Carleton (Mr. Sterling) introduced Bill 132, An Act to include members of the Legislative Assembly in the Public Service Pension Plan and to make related amendments to other Acts.

Upon reviewing the Bill, I have determined that it would cause an expenditure of public money out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund, contrary to Standing Order 56.

Accordingly, I have directed that the Bill not be printed, and that it be deleted from the Orders and Notices Paper.
