- \$91 million to fire nurses;
- \$90 million to close or consolidate community care access centres;
- \$16 million for Dalton McGuinty’s “I won’t raise your taxes” Liberal ad agency;
- \$2 million for LHIN office furniture and design; and
- \$55 million (at least) on Caledonia.
