Mr. Chudleigh moved,

That, in the opinion of this House, the McGuinty government should agree to define its proposed Tire Tax as a "tax", like the \$2.6 billion Health Tax, and the McGuinty government should immediately cancel all plans to implement the \$60-million tax on purchasing new tires that will impact all Ontarians.

A debate arising, at 11:00 a.m., further proceedings were reserved until 12:00 noon.

Mr. Moridi then moved,

That, in the opinion of this House, the Government of Ontario must demonstrate, in its promotion of diversity, the acknowledgement of the first day of Spring, which may be anytime between March 20th to the 22nd, as Nowruz.
