- Ensuring that persons aged 14 and older convicted of violent crimes face sentences proportionate to the severity of the crime, including life for 1st - or 2nd - degree murder; and
- Making it easier to detain young offenders, prior to trial, who are charged with violent offences, or a pattern of offences.
