ORDRE DU JOUR

À l'appel de l'ordre du jour sur la motion portant deuxième lecture du projet de loi 122, Loi visant à accroître la responsabilisation financière des organismes du secteur parapublic,

Pursuant to the Order of the House of November 4, 2010, the Speaker put the question forthwith on the motion, and declared his opinion that the Ayes had it, and a recorded vote having been demanded,

The Speaker directed that the Members be called in, for which purpose the division bells were rung.

During the ringing of the bells, the Speaker addressed the House as follows:-

I have received a request from the Chief Government Whip, under Standing Order 28(h), that the vote on the motion for Second Reading of Bill 122, An Act to increase the financial accountability of organizations in the broader public sector, be deferred until November 16, 2010.

Therefore the vote is accordingly deferred.

Debate was resumed on the motion for Second Reading of Bill 172, An Act to amend the Ticket Speculation Act.

Pursuant to Standing Order 47(c), the Acting Speaker (Mrs. Munro) interrupted the proceedings and announced that there had been six and one-half hours of debate on Second Reading of Bill 172, An Act to amend the Ticket Speculation Act, and that the debate would be deemed adjourned.

A debate arose on the motion for Third Reading of Bill 99, An Act to amend the Taxation Act, 2007 to implement the children's activity tax credit.

After some time, the House then adjourned at 5:57 p.m.

Il s'élève un débat sur la motion portant troisième lecture du projet de loi 99, Loi modifiant la Loi de 2007 sur les impôts pour mettre en œuvre le crédit d'impôt pour les activités des enfants.

Après quelque temps, à 17 h 57, la chambre a ensuite ajourné ses travaux.
