Mr. Dunlop – That, in the opinion of this House, whereas the McGuinty-Wynne Government's decision to create the *Ontario College of Trades* will impose yet another job-killing tax on hardworking trades-people by levying millions upon millions of dollars of new fees that have no clear benefit and that will go to a new government bureaucracy that is not accountable, resulting in increased costs of trades services upon everyday Ontarians; and,
